


# **Context: Global Scale & Impact**

#### Land Area

- 13,064 m ha
- Non-Forest Area
  - 9,007 m ha (69.1%)
- Forest Area
  - 3,870 m ha (29.6%)
- Industrial Plantation
  - 90 m ha (0.6 %)
- Non-industrial Plantation
  - 97 m ha (0.7%)

#### **Global Areas**



Industrial <u>Plantation Forest</u> Production of Global Industrial Roundwood, 35% in 2000; est. 40% by 2020

#### Industrial <u>Planted Forests</u>


- Corporate for industrial processing

  - Conservation
















#### **Justification**

Stakeholders expressed need for a neutral, balanced reference Framework – a "Code of Best Practices" for responsible planted forest development including:

- Ethical Framework
- International Framework
- Guiding Principles
- Standards





## **Objectives**

"Provide the framework for the economic, cultural, social and environmental dimensions of planted forests in supply of wood, fibre, non-wood forest products and services, whilst contributing positively to sustainable forest management, integrated land-use and livelihoods"

## **Global Survey**

#### Survey Commenced in 58 Countries in June 2005

- 30 countries accounting for 97% of Global Plantations (FRA 2000)
- Selected countries with significant areas of semi-natural forests of Europe and Nth America

- Survey completed, August, 2005
- Planted Forest Thematic Status, Trends, Issues, Dec, 2005
- Global Outlook Forest Planted Forests (update), July, 2006
