Peru Field Dialogue on REDD+ Benefit Sharing

Field Trip Objectives

24-26 February, 2014

Below is a list of key issues that we hope can guide your thinking through our field trip in San Martin, Peru and help you link the field trip observations with the latter discussions in Lima. It is not an exhaustive list and is only meant to be reference for you to develop more focused questions that can benefit our broader discussion later on REDD+ Benefit Sharing design and implementation.

- Who has the ownership rights over the forest land? Who has user rights over the forest?
- What were the key activities being carried out before REDD+ was introduced? What has changed with REDD+? What are the expected changes under REDD+?
- Who are the key beneficiaries? On what basis are the beneficiaries identified?
- What are the key benefits shared? Are there any non-monetary benefits? If so, what are the non-monetary benefits?
- How are the monetary benefits distributed?
- On what basis are the benefits shared?
- What are the costs related to implementing REDD+?
- Can the lessons learnt from the field sites inform the design and implementation of REDD+ Benefit Sharing at the national level? If so, what are the key relevant lessons learnt?
